COVTR Membership Meeting - May 11, 2021

Officers Present: President – John Colson, Vice President – John Barron

No new members.

President John Colson opened the meeting at 7 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Dave Hogan.

President John Colson awarded Door Prizes: Rausch Performance T-Shirt to John Barron and an LED Light to Bonne Billotte.

Meeting Minutes: John Gauldin motioned that we accept the minutes as printed in the May newsletter, seconded by Dave Hogan. However, Mike Piggott made a motion to correct the minutes to reflect a change for both the Drive-In Movie Night to Guthrie, OK and the Fall Foliage Tour to Eureka Springs, AR. The change requested by Jean Gauldin was to remove the name of Jean Gauldin from the sponsoring for each event. Both events will reflect only John Gauldin's name as the sponsor. John Gauldin concurred with the change. A motion to accept the corrected minutes was made by John Gauldin, seconded by Judy Piggott. Motion carried. The COVTR Activities Calendar for 2021 will be updated to reflect this change.

Treasurer's Report – Mike Piggott

Mike Piggott read the current Treasurer's Report to the membership. Mike announced that this report covers the club funds and activities through April 2021. Due to the impact of our hosting the VTR National event in September of this year, Mike suggests that we no longer include the Treasurer's Report in our widely circulated newsletter as our club funds have ballooned due to National registrations and sponsor donation pledges.

Mike announced that we are currently at 66 Registrations for the National event with more than 90 days remaining to accept additional Registrations. The budget plan is based upon 120 registrations so expectations are that we will meet or exceed this number. Mike announced that the club is obligated to purchase Autocross Insurance through VTR to host the VTR National event. The cost of this insurance is \$250. Drew Holliday made a motion to pay this fee and Judy Piggott seconded. Motion passed. Lonny Wall made a suggestion that we may want to consider adding a charge to Autocross participants to offset this charge. Mike Piggott suggested that this additional fee be discussed at the National Membership Meeting held during the VTR National event this year.

Current expenses to date to support the National event are \$405 for centerpieces for the banquet tables. Additional expenses will be incurred over time as we draw closer to the event.

Mike Piggott said that he recently transferred our PayPal Club account deposits to our regular club bank account. The PayPal account is used to accept Registrations on-line by attendees.

A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report as read and seconded by Mike Piggott. Motion passed. Regrettably, I did not record the individual names of those that made and seconded the motion.

Activities Report – Mike Piggott

Mike briefly described the Triumph Drive and lunch event held at the Rock Café in Stroud, OK on Friday, April 30. Mike Piggott announced that the Old Chicken Farm Antique Sale event, sponsored by Jerry & Sue Stewart was cancelled as the event had already occurred.

The next event for the month of May is the outing to the Chicken Shack located in Luther, OK being hosted by Dave & Mary Jo Hogan. Dave announced that the group that would like to drive out together would meet at the exit drive from the entry area to the Life Church property located near 2nd Street and I-35 North for a departure at 1:30 PM. Reservations have been made for a 2:00 PM lunch gathering at the restaurant. Triumphs are encouraged for the drive but not required – come one come all. The weather is projected to be beautiful.

Mike also announced that on May 28 - 31, the city of Enid is hosting a Celebrate Freedom event as a Weekend Tribute to Honor Our Veterans with the dedication of a Veterans Memorial Bridge. COVTR member Kip Miles is sponsoring our participation and will host the participates for a lunch at his Enid home following the Dedication. Club members are encouraged to drive their Triumphs to participate. The dedication event will be hosted by the AMBUCS organization on Friday morning at 10:30 AM beginning at AMBUCS Park, 924 W. Oak, Enid, OK. Contact Lonny Wall at 405 206-3900 and/or Kip Miles at 508 747-0910 for additional details. Mike Piggott also discussed the planned but not yet scheduled Bricktown Baseball Outing to Oklahoma City suggesting a date of Friday, July 2 when the OKC Dodgers will be at home for a 7:05 PM game. Mike and Judy Piggott will be sponsoring this event. The OKC Dodgers will also be at home during the VTR National event in September so this could be offered as an outing for those attendees that might be interested in attending a ballgame during our event.

Old Business

John Gauldin thanked John Colson and Lonny Wall for searching and locating the Santa Fe Cattle Co restaurant to host our COVTR meetings now and into the future.

John Colson discussed the past issues that caused us to seek another location several years ago when the restaurant would double-book the room causing two groups to attempt to use the meeting room at the same time. The Santa Fe Cattle Co representative reassured John that this would not occur again. At the present time we will be scheduled to meet at the Santa Fe restaurant on the second Tuesday of each month.

New Business

Drew Holliday provided an update on the VTR National event. GoodParts has pledged \$1,000 to support our event.

Drew also asked if any club member would be interested in designing Custom Special Awards for the following events:

Fastest Time of Day (Autocross) TSD Rally Best of Show (Concours)

He has budgeted \$100 to 150 per Award.

Drew discussed the Green Country Triumph Club's participation in the VTR National event with Art Graves at the recent Rock Café outing. Art has accepted responsibility for the Car Wash and the Funkhana activities/events and has a good support plan in place.

Registrations are progressing well and the host hotel is fully booked at this time. Information is on our VTR National Registration website identifying alternate hotels located near 2nd Street & I-35. No agreements or arrangements have been made with these nearby hotels.

Veterans' Memorial Bridge Enid, OK

The Veterans' Memorial Bridge, which carries traffic over the BNSF Rail Yard at the 600 block



of N Van Buren in Enid, Oklahoma, was officially dedicated May 28 at 10:30 am at ABC Park, and COVTR was well represented.

Speakers and other program participants for the event included: State Commander Michael Merit of VFW Oklahoma, ODOT's Secretary of Transportation Tim Gatz, Commander 71 FTW Colonel Jay A. Johnson, Oklahoma District 19 Senator Roland Pederson, Oklahoma District 40 Representative Chad Caldwell,

Mayor George Pankonin, Spiritual Dancer Michael Littlevoice of the Ponca/Omaha Tribe, Pas-

tor Wade Burleson of Emmanuel Enid, and the Enid High School JROTC.

Enid AM AMBUCS obtained approval to name the overpass the Veterans' Memorial Bridge and will fly around 200 American flags on holidays and special occasions along both sides of the bridge. Along with the American flags there will be seven service flags.
